# **Roads Department**

In the Municipality, there is NO overnight parking on any streets or in parking lots from November 15 to April 15 annually. Outside of those dates, parking is permitted on certain streets. Check with municipal by-laws to confirm which streets.

#### 911 SIGNS

Property owners are responsible for notifying the Municipality of Central Huron if their 5-digit number has been damaged or stolen. Those that would like a new sign with their name on it are asked to contact a sign shop that makes them.

#### STREET LIGHTING

The Municipality has street lights in many of the hamlets and in town. If you notice that a street light doesn't work, call the Municipality at 519-482-3997 to report it. Each pole has a 4-digit identification number for that light. Please have that number ready when you call.

#### **LANDOWNERS**

Mud on the road is dangerous and more slippery than ice. Please ensure our rural roads are kept clean and safe. A person who deposits mud onto the roadway may be liable if an accident occurs.



#### **SIDEWALKS**

Please refrain from placing garbage and recycling bins or other objects on sidewalks. This restricts snow removal and hinders accessibility.

#### **SNOW MOVING**

Pushing snow to the other side of the road when clearing your laneway is prohibited. There is a by-law in place that prohibits this practice.

#### **COMPOST SITE**

The Municipality has a compost site at 40131 Hydro Line Rd. It is a drop-off spot for leaves, brush, garden waste, and household kitchen scraps. Items can be dropped off at your leisure. A limited number of paper bags can be picked up at town hall. This is not a drop-off for construction materials, unwanted fill, cement blocks, plastic bags, flowers in pots, etc: this material should go to the landfill. This is a free service for Central Huron residents that should not be abused.



# PREVENTING WASTED WATER IN YOUR HOME

### Toilet Leaks

Significant amounts of water can be wasted with toilet leaks. If water is still running after a flush, or you can hear water running, your toilet is leaking.

Most leaks occur at the overflow pipe or at the plunger ball inside the tank. To locate leaks, remove the tank lid and flush the toilet. The water level should come to roughly 1/2 an inch below the overflow pipe. Try adjusting the float level control screw so that the valve shuts off the water at the proper level. If the valve is leaking you may need to contact a plumber.

Toilets may also have silent leaks. To test for this, put a few drops of food colouring into the tank, but DO NOT FLUSH. Wait 10 minutes. If you see colour in the toilet bowl, you have a silent leak. It is most likley leaking around the plunger ball or flapper valve at the bottom of the tank. These are easy to fix with parts available at a hardware store.

Leaky Faucets

Most leaks result from worn washers in faucets and showerheads. All faucets (including those seldom used, such as utility sinks or in basements) should be checked periodically. Repairing faucets is easy; just shut off water supply to the specific faucet, replace the washer, and turn the water supply on again. If you feel you need some asistance, check out a do-it-yourself publication or ask a qualified person.

Check hoses to your washing machine and dishwahswer and replace them every five years.

### **Your Well – Your Responsibility**

# If you own a private well, it's your responsibility to ensure the water is safe for your family.

#### **TEST YOUR WELL WATER**

- o Three (3) times a year, especially after a rain event
- o Free water sample bottles available at Huron Perth Public Health, Mon.-Thurs. 8:30 am 4 pm

#### **PROTECT YOUR WELL**

Take 15 paces in four directions from your well – what is in your well's 'Protection Zone'?

#### Try to make sure you don't have:

- o Dog tied to well or chicken coop (E. coli)
- o Brush piles providing homes for vermin
- o Pooling water (mound up soil around the casing so water flows away from well)
- o A shed with fuel and chemicals (place in a tote or cabinet to prevent spills or leaks)
- o A loose or damaged well cap (earwigs love wet spaces)



#### **MAINTAIN YOUR SEPTIC SYSTEM**

A faulty septic system is very often the cause of well contamination

Get the tank pumped every 3 – 5 years (especially before a big family event!)

- o Don't drive over the leaching bed and crush lines
- Don't put harsh cleaners, chemicals, fats, oils or grease down the drain (it kills hard working bacteria)
- o Don't plant gardens, shrubs or trees on your system (the roots will block the lines)

Your well and septic system are expensive but essential assets. If they need work, call a professional. For more information watch 'Your Well, Your Responsibility' at https://www.sourcewaterinfo.on.ca/news/videos/

#### **Water Wise Events**

Only 2% of well owners in Huron County test their water. Approximately 30% of those samples come back contaminated. Would your community group like to host a Water Wise water sampling event? Sample bottles are made available in the community or can be picked up at the event. Collected



samples are kept chilled and delivered for transport to the Public Health Lab in London the next morning. By assisting well owners with a convenient way to sample their wells, about 1/3 of wells in these communities have been sampled at each event. Call 519-235-2610, or toll-free 1-888-286-2610, extension 247, to find out more.

#### **Source Water Protection**

Property owners, real estate agents or farmer lease holders, where municipal water systems exist, you can find out if the property is located in a Wellhead Protection Area by looking at the Source Protection Information Atlas online mapping available at https://www.ontario.ca/page/source-protection. Potential threats to drinking water include chemicals, fuel, waste oil, salt application, snow storage, manure, fer-

tilizer, and pesticides. When in close proximity to the municipal well, using and storing these products carefully is important to protect the municipal well supply that serves the community. www.sourcewaterinfo.on.ca





#### **BUILDING DEPARTMENT**

#### O A D A BAKO UN PAO



The Primary Role of the Building Department is to promote public safety and assist development in compliance with all applicable laws.

The Building Department is a multi-faceted department with its major roles including enforcement of the Ontario Building Code, Municipal by-laws, property standards, zoning administration and source water protection. The building department also oversees septic and plumbing permits and the required inspection services. These roles ensure compatibility and protection of adjacent land uses, maintenance and sustainability of properties and the quality of life for Central Huron residents and visitors.

#### BU DNGPR

A building Permit is your formal permission to begin construction or demolition. It means that the Municipality of Central Huron has approved plans for a new structure, an addition, an alteration, a renovation or change of use of a structure.

Contact the Municipality of Central Huron if you are unsure whether you require a permit for your project. Even though your project may not require a building permit, you must still comply with the requirements of the Zoning By-Law and any other applicable laws. It is the property owner's responsibility to ensure that a Building Permit is obtained prior to any work starting, when required.

Approved Building Permit plans must comply with

the Ontario Building Code, local zoning by-laws and other applicable laws. Building permits regulate the type or use of a structure allowed within the community and ensures that building standards are met. The building permit process protects each property owner's interests, as well as the community at large and provides for the erection of safe, legal and sound structures.

#### NDO N DABU DNGPR

All new buildings, prefabricated buildings and accessory buildings over 10 square metres require a permit. Repairs, alterations, renovations and additions to existing buildings need a permit.

Swimming pools, sewage systems, plumbing alterations, mobile homes, temporary tents and structures need one as well. Demolitions also require a permit.

Applications are available at the town hall or on the Central Huron website.

Submit your completed application and applicable drawings to the building department. They will be reviewed by the Chief Building Official and a permit issued if your plans comply with building regulations. You will need to set up building inspections as per the instructions on your permit.







### MARRIAGE LICENSES

The Municipality of Central Huron Clerk's Department issues marriage licenses.

- Licenses are issued at the Municipal Office, 23 Albert St. Clinton during office hours from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm, Monday to Friday. The current fee for a license is \$115.00. We ask that you allow for 5 business days for us to process your marriage license.
- At least one applicant to the proposed marriage must apply in person; however the completed Marriage License Application must be signed and dated by both applicants.
- 2 valid pieces of I.D. are required for both parties. One of which must be either a current Passport or Birth Certificate. The second piece of Identification may be either a valid Driver's License or Photo Health Card.
- A Marriage License is valid in Ontario only for a period of 90 days from the Date of Issuance.
- Call the Municipal office at (519)482-3997 or check out the website for further details and / or to print out application forms.

#### **AUBURN DOG PARK**

The Auburn Dog Park is located behind the ball diamond. There is a laneway and parking area south of the diamond off Hardwood Line, so you can now drive quite close to the gates. The laneway is not accessible in Winter, but the dog park gates are kept open throughout the year. You can walk or snow shoe in through the ball diamond. It is accessible in daylight hours only.

We have a small dog section and large dog section, both of which are fully fenced. There are picnic tables in both sections of the park, so bring a book and enjoy the day! Be sure to follow current COVID protocol. Please stoop and scoop and keep our dog park clean. There is a garbage can and doggy

bags for waste. Please bring your own water for your pet.

Dog treats, leashes and toys are available for purchase at the Auburn Huron Bay Farm Supply.

### **2024 DOG TAGS**



If you no longer have a dog(s), we ask that you please return the dog tag(s) to the Municipal office to the attention of Cathy Kovacs before March 31, 2024, in order to have your name removed from our list.

Failure to let us know by this date will result in full payment required. If you no longer have your dog after March 31, 2024 and payment is not made for the tag you will be responsible for full payment. If you have any questions or concerns, please don't hesitate to contact Cathy Kovacs at 519-482-3997 Ext. 1229 or ckovacs@centralhuron.com

The new Municipality Lifetime Dog Tag system is still in place. The tag is not for a specific year like it has been in the past. Your dog will have the same tag while they reside in Central Huron. We will still send out an invoice annually for a renewal license fee of \$25 for regular breeds.

Dog tag payments are due by March 31 2024. An additional \$20 PER DOG will be added as of April 1st

if full payment hasn't been received.

If your invoice is still outstanding by the end of the July, your dog tag fees will be applied to your property tax account or sent for collections.


If you need to replace your dog's lifetime tag over the years due to wear or loss, there will be a \$10 replacement fee per tag.




