Our Story

On June 6th, 2017 after a battle with substance use disorder, Tanner Steffler was poisoned by a drug overdose at the young age of 19.

But Tanner's disorder is not what defined him. Tanner was a typical teen, and could at first glance be anyone's child. His story solidifies for us that addiction and mental health can impact anyone's child, no matter their colour, creed, income or status.



It is in Tanners memory, and the memory of all those we've lost to drug toxicity and suicide, that we work to create a culture of change.

The Tanner Steffler Foundation is a grassroots non-profit providing advocacy, education, navigation, peer support to youth (12-29 yrs of age) who struggle with mental health and/or problematic substance use, along with their families and caregivers in Huron & Perth Counties. Together, we have the power to create true, meaningful change in our rural communities.

What Does TSF Do?

Training & Education

We offer interactive, educational presentations and workshops on mental health, addiction, suicide awareness and prevention.

Resource Navigation

We offer assistance in navigating youth through Huron & Perth County Mental Health & Addiction resources & networks. We can help connect youth & their families to the various services available and will support your journey.

Peer & Family Support

We offer peer support to youth (12-29) and their caretakers through our Peer & Family Support Program. The journey can be hard, but you don't need to do it alone!

Youth Advisory Council

Listening to and empowering youth voice is one of our cornerstones. Our YAC meets bi-weekly to discuss what they see as needs in our community, and to help guide the direction of TSF. YAC is also a registered Jack.org Community Chapter for Huron County!

Youth Hub & Programming

Our Youth Hub offers a safe, welcoming, quiet area where youth can gather during specific times to get support, do school work, hang out, and have fun. We also offer free programming activities that support youth though mental health and substance use challenges.

High demand and limited resources has resulted in long wait times and in some cases, restricted service offerings.

Stigma remains a significant issue and holds clients back from accessing services and developing MH&A literacy.

Moments matter. They could include making sure someone is as comfortable as possible at the end of their life. Moments could happen when someone learns how to manage what can feel like uncontrollable feelings of grief. Moments are all about building lasting memories. At Huron Hospice, we provide hospice palliative care and grief support in our rural communities so individuals and their loved ones can create moments that matter.



In Your Home, trained volunteers offer companionship and emotional support to people who are at the end of life. They also offer respite for caregivers who need a break.

At Bender House, nurses and volunteers provide 24/7 care in a home-like environment. Bender House has private bedrooms with fireplaces and patios. There is plenty of space for families to gather.



Loss and Grief Services are available for children, youth and adults. Sometimes people need a little help learning how to manage feelings of grief. Without help, unchecked grief can affect the whole family.



You Can Make A Difference

Care available at Huron Hospice is always free, but providing these services is not free. Government funding covers only part of what it takes to provide care. There are several ways you can make moments matter.

Make Every Day Matter: A day of care costs \$1,000. Choose a day that is special to you (an anniversary, a birthday, or the memory of a loved one). When you give \$1,000, you cover the cost of care on that day. Give individually, or as a family. You Make Every Day Matter.

Candlelight Memorial Walk: In early April, we gather at dusk on the Taylor Trail near Varna to remember loved ones. Walking by the light of candles in the woods is a wonderful way to remember someone.

In September 1926, teacher Fred Sloman stepped aboard CNR School Car No. 1 and began a journey unlike any other, delivering the Ontario curriculum to children of all ages along the remote rail line between Capreol and Foley.

For decades, the School on Wheels brought education, community, and connection to families living far from traditional schools.

Today, we honour that legacy.



Clinton's WATER FOUNTAIN

The Fountain Project was created to honour Sandra Garnet, a beloved Isaac Street store owner who dedicated 28 years to downtown Clinton and the BIA. After her passing, plans to tear up Isaac Street for sewer work included removing a parkette at the street's head. The municipality chose to dedicate the area as a memorial to Sandy's contributions.

Discussions soon expanded the project's purpose to celebrate all community volunteers, past and present. When a drinking fountain proved unfeasible, the concept evolved into a sculptural water fountain. Collaborating with local metal sculptor, Jim Wallace, the team developed the abstract triple 'V' design symbolizing the three elements of volunteerism: selflessness, sacrifice, and service. It was revealed prior to Remembrance Day in recognition of our veterans, the ultimate volunteers.




Celebration Orchard

The Celebration Orchard began with a simple act of friendship. When I couldn't attend a friend's funeral, I looked for a meaningful way to honour her. The funeral home website offered a \$50 "memorial tree," which I later learned was a \$1 reforestation seedling, with no way to verify it's location. I decided I could do better in Central Huron!



The idea progressed and became the Celebration Orchard. A place where families can dedicate real, visible trees they can visit anytime. As food costs rose and schools noticed emptier lunch boxes, the memorial tree project evolved to become an orchard of fruit trees. Fruit from these trees is available for all residents to use. Help yourself in order to make a pie, add to a lunch box or donate to the local food banks. Each tree comes with a personalized metal 'leaf' to place on the dedication sign.

Trees can be purchased to celebrate any occasion... birth of a new baby, marriage, anniversary, birthday or the passing of someone special. This is a space to celebrate our loved ones!





i Marriage Licenses

The Municipality of Central Huron Clerk's Department issues marriage licenses.

Licenses are issued at the Municipal Office, 23 Albert St. Clinton during office hours from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm, Monday to Friday. The current fee for a license is \$125.00. We ask that you allow for 5 business days for us to process your marriage license.

At least one applicant to the proposed marriage must apply in person; however the completed Marriage License Application must be signed and dated by both applicants.

2 valid pieces of government issued I.D. are required for both parties. One piece must have a photo.

A Marriage License is valid in Ontario only for a period of 90 days from the Date of Issuance.

BUILDING DEPARTMENT

i Office Location and Primary Role

The Building Department of the Municipality of Central Huron is located at the back of the Municipal office.

The primary role of the Building Department is to promote public safety and assist development in compliance with all applicable laws. The Building Department is a multifaceted department with its major roles including enforcement of the Ontario Building Code, municipal by-laws, property standards, zoning administration, and source water protection. The Building Department also oversees septic and plumbing permits and the required inspection services. These roles ensure compatibility and protection of adjacent land uses, maintenance and sustainability of properties and the quality of life for Central Huron residents and visitors.

i When do I need a Building Permit?

All new buildings, prefabricated buildings and accessory buildings over 10 square metres require a permit. Repairs, alterations, renovations and additions to existing buildings need a permit. Swimming pools, sewage systems, plumbing alterations, mobile homes, temporary tents and structures need one as well. Demolitions also require a permit.



i Building Permits

A building permit is your formal permission to begin construction or demolition. It means that the Municipality of Central Huron has approved plans for a new structure, an addition, an alteration, a renovation or change of use of a structure. Contact the Municipality of Central Huron if you are unsure whether you require a permit for your project. Even though your project may not require a building permit, you must still comply with the requirements of the Zoning By-Law and any other applicable laws. It is the property owner's responsibility to ensure that a building permit is obtained prior to any work starting, when required. Approved Building Permit plans must comply with the Ontario Building Code, local zoning by-laws and other applicable laws. Building permits regulate the type or use of a structure allowed within the community and ensures that building standards are met. The building permit process protects each property owner's interests, as well as the community at large and provides for the erection of safe, legal and sound structures.

i How do I get a Building Permit?

The Municipality of Central Huron Building Department accepts all permit applications through our online system, Cloudpermit. This software allows you to submit a number of permit applications online. We do understand that not everyone will be able to submit digital files and we will still be accepting hard copy submissions to our office.

To start, create your Cloudpermit account at ca.cloudpermit.com. Once registered, you can apply for permits and track its progress online. Any further questions see the Municipal website at www.centralhuron.com or call the Municipal office at 519-482-3997 (Toll free 1-866-695-3364).



In Central Huron, the average residential property is assessed at \$213,000 and paid approximately \$3,169.46 in taxes in 2025 (\$3,050,48 in 2024). The County of Huron received \$1,153.24, \$325.89 went to the school boards and Central Huron received \$1,690.33 which was spent as shown below.

i Dog Tags

Central Huron has a lifetime dog tag program. Invoices will be sent to owners annually for a renewal license fee. All Dogs in the Municipality must be licensed as per our Animal Control By-Law.

The tag must be worn on your dog at all times. A dog tag is the best form of identification for your dog as it will help with returning lost dogs to their owners. If your dog is picked up without a dog license you may be subject to additional fees. Invoices for dog license fees have been mailed out and the amount on the invoice is due no later than March 31.

A late payment charge of \$20 will go on your account for each dog as of April 1 if you do not make payment. If you no longer have your dog please return your tag to the Municipal office. Invoices cannot be reversed until the tag is returned.

i Roadside Mowing

Roadside mowing will be contracted out. Anyone having small trees and shrubs should have them well marked as the Municipality will not be responsible for any damage. Owners of vacant lots are advised that it is their responsibility to maintain weeds and excess grass under the Property Standards Act.

i Landfill

For larger amounts such as a garage clean out or house renovations, refuse can be taken to the former landfill site but must be separated amongst the various recycle bins and non recyclables. The cost is dependant on weight but the minimum is \$20. Additional fees apply for larger items like furniture and mattresses. Hazardous wastes are still accepted at the site. The site is open 8 am until 12:30 pm Tuesday through Saturday. For more information call 519 482-7668.

i Spring and Fall Leaf Pick-up

The Spring pick-up is the last week in April and the first week in May. The Fall pick-up will begin at the start of October to mid-November, weather permitting. Leaves must be in brown paper bags which are available at the Municipal Office. Two bundles per household only. If you require more they can be purchased at the local hardware store. Brush must be tied in bundles no longer than 4 feet, and weigh less than 50 pounds.

i Sidewalks

Please don't place garbage & recycling bins or other objects on sidewalks. This restricts snow removal and hinders accessibility.

i Hydro Emergencies

i Parking

There is NO overnight parking on any streets or parking lots from November 15 to April 15 annually. Outside of those dates, parking is permitted on certain streets. Check with municipal by-laws to confirm the streets.

i 911 Signs

Property owners are responsible for notifying the Municipality if their 5-digit number has been damaged or stolen. Please ensure that your sign is visible for emergency services. If you want a name sign, contact a sign shop.

i Snow Moving and Mud

Pushing snow to the other side of the road when clearing your laneway is prohibited by by-law. Mud on the road is dangerous and more slippery than ice. Please ensure our rural roads are kept clean and safe. A person who deposits mud onto the roadway may be liable if an accident occurs.

i Street Lighting

If you notice that a street light doesn't work, call the Municipality at 519-482-3997 to report it. Each pole has a 4-digit identification number for that light. Please have that number ready.

i Compost Site

The compost site is at 40131 Hydro Line Road. It is a drop off spot for leaves, brush, garden waste and kitchen scraps. No construction materials, fill, cement blocks, plastic bag, flowers in pots, etc. This free service should not be abused.




