****Leaf/Brush Pick-Up****

The fall pick-up will begin October 12th to November 16th, weather permitting. Brush must be tied in bundles no longer than 4 feet, and cannot weigh more than 50 pounds. Leaves must be in brown paper bags which are available at the Municipal Office (in limited quantities per household). If you require additional bags they can be purchased at the local hardware stores. For those who wish to take their own leaves and compost, the drop off site is at 40131 Hydro Line Road – just east of the Cemetery, open 7 days a week. **ACCEPTABLE ONLY:** Leaves, brush, grass clippings and kitchen compost. This is **not a drop off** for construction materials, unwanted fill, cement blocks, plastic bags, or flowers still in pots, as this material should go to the landfill. This is a free service that should not be abused.

Parking

There is **NO** overnight parking on any streets or parking lots from Nov 15th to April 15th of each year within the Municipality. Prior to that, there is parking allowed on certain streets, one should check with Municipal By-Law for those streets.

ALL OUTDOOR WATER USE

For such purposes as gardening, lawns, washing vehicles and filling pools etc., is only permitted as follows:

In the morning between 7:00 a.m. – 9:00 a.m.

In the evening between 7:00 p.m. – 9:00 p. m.

on EVEN Calendar Days if your house number is EVEN (e.g. 4, 16, 118, 72394)

on ODD Calendar Days if your house number is ODD (e.g. 5, 17, 119, 72395)

Please note that residences with automated sprinkler systems please adjust your system to run between 2:00 a.m. and 4:00 a.m.

Violators of the watering restrictions will be subject to a Non Compliance Fee as set out in the Rates Bylaw 40-2018 Part 8

2023 Budget

The 2023 residential tax rate for Central Huron purposes has increased 7.44% from 2022 and the overall tax rate including the County of Huron rate and the School Board is a 6.21% increase from 2022. The 2023 Budget represents cash requirements in the amount of \$8,851,861.

Major capital projects for 2023 include: Urban Reconstruction of Isaac Street at a cost of \$2,737,945, Top coat paving of Bandon Line, Cutter Street, James Street, Matilda Street, Mohawk Crescent, Victoria Terrace, Walker Street, and Whitehead Street at a cost of \$405,249, Bridge and Culvert repair of Mainstreet Holmesville Culvert at a cost of \$374,946, Recreation and Facilities projects including Clinton Dog Park, Town Hall and Library Windows, Holmesville Hall Exterior Repairs, Londesborough Ball Diamond Fencing and Booth Renovations and Londesborough Hall Accessibility Upgrades at a cost of \$480,000.
