### From the Fire Chief

The Central Huron Fire Department wants to remind everyone to ensure you have working smoke and carbon monoxide alarms:

- Install working smoke alarms on every story of your home and outside all sleeping areas. It's the law!
- For extra protection, install a smoke alarm in every bedroom and a carbon monoxide alarm on every story.
- Test your smoke and carbon monoxide alarms once a month.

- Change alarm batteries annually or whenever the low-battery warning sounds.
- Always follow the manufacturer's instructions for installing, testing, maintaining, and replacing smoke and carbon monoxide alarms.

### Public Works Department

The spring pick-up will be held during the last week in April and the first week in May. The fall pick-up will begin at the start of October to mid-November, weather permitting. Leaves must be in brown paper bags which are available at the Municipal Office. Two bundles per household only. If you require more, they can be purchased at the local hardware store. Brush must be tied in bundles no longer than 4 feet, and cannot weigh more than 50 pounds. For those who wish to take their own leaves and compost, the drop off site is at 40131 Hydro Line Road – just East of the Cemetery. Open 7 days a week Mon-Fri 7:30am-5:00pm, Sat, Sun 10:00am-4:00pm. ACCEPTABLE ONLY: Leaves, brush, grass clippings and kitchen compost. NOT ACCEPTABLE: plastics, plastic containers, metal, lumber, cement, tires, appliances and garbage. This is a free service that should not be abused.

### Roadside Mowing

Roadside mowing will be contracted out. Anyone having small trees and shrubs should have them well marked as the Municipality will not be responsible for any damage. Owners of vacant lots are advised that it is their responsibility to maintain weeds and excess grass under the Property Standards Act.

## 2022 Property Tax Installment Dates

Interim Billing (based on 50% of 2021 taxes) 1<sup>st</sup> installment is due March 31, 2022 and 2<sup>nd</sup> installment is due June 30, 2022.

## Methods of Tax Payment

Automatic Banking Machines, Telephone & Internet Payments, Payments at most Financial Institutions, Post Dated Cheques, Mail, Drop Box at Municipal Office (if open to the public), Pre-authorized Monthly Payments, and Pre-Authorized Installment Payments are all accepted.

For tax payments, please record your 19-digit roll number. Each Roll number requires a separate payment. Do NOT pay multiple properties on one Roll number. For Utilities and other payments, please record the full 10-digit account number. Each account requires a separate payment. Do not pay multiple accounts on one account number. Please refer to our current fee By-law 99-2021 on our website for new and updated fees such as statement fees etc.
